Amount: Various - Approximately 15-20 scholarships of different amounts
The selection of the recipients for the scholarships will be determined solely by the Lions Scholarship Awards Committee and is based on the scholarship budget approved by the membership.

- Scholarships may be awarded to students attending any post-secondary school (trade, vocational, college, university) that is accredited and in compliance with all Federal and State Government Agencies.
