Declaration of Surplus Property
(2009 Blue Bird School Bus #10)

WHEREAS, RCW 28A.335.180 gives the Board of Directors of the Coupeville School District No. 204 the exclusive power to declare for public bid and/or acquisition of surplus property; and

WHEREAS, the District maintains a school bus fleet and it has been determined that the 2009 Blue Bird School Bus #10, VIN: 1BABNCKAX9F263084, is no longer needed for district purposes and is considered surplus personal property;

WHEREAS, any school district or educational service district, pursuant to the requirements of RCW 28A.335.180, may dispose of surplus educational equipment as attached;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the District's Superintendent shall be directed to elicit bids for the sale or scrapping and proper removal of identified surplus property. The bids shall be awarded to any person(s) that generates the greatest revenue for the District.





RCW 28A.335.180

Surplus texts and other educational aids, notice of availability — Student priority as to texts.

(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, school districts, educational service districts, or any other state or local governmental agency concerned with education, when declaring texts and other books, equipment, materials or relocatable facilities as surplus, shall, prior to other disposal thereof, serve notice in writing in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district and to any public school district or private school in Washington state annually requesting such a notice, that the same is available for sale, rent, or lease to public school districts or approved private schools, at depreciated cost or fair market value, whichever is greater: PROVIDED, That students wishing to purchase texts pursuant to RCW [28A.320.230](#)(2) shall have priority as to such texts. The notice requirement in this section does not apply to the sale or transfer of assistive devices under RCW [28A.335.205](#) or chapter [72.40](#) RCW. Such districts or agencies shall not otherwise sell, rent or lease such surplus property to any person, firm, organization, or nongovernmental agency for at least thirty days following publication of notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the school district.

(2) In lieu of complying with subsection (1) of this section, school districts and educational service districts may elect to grant surplus personal property to a federal, state, or local governmental entity, or to indigent persons, at no cost on the condition the property be used for preschool through twelfth grade educational purposes, or elect to loan surplus personal property to a nonreligious, nonsectarian private entity on the condition the property be used for the preschool through twelfth grade education of members of the public on a nondiscriminatory basis.

Methods of Disposal

Alternate Disposal Methods

In accordance with the surplus policy of each district, the following are offered as possible methods for disposal and/or revenue generation of surplus materials:

- Sell to a licensed salvage or scrap dealer submitting the highest bid
- Sell on consignment
- Sell at depreciated cost or fair market value, whichever is greater, to any public school
- Items, which cannot be sold but are recyclable, may be deposited with a commercial recycle dealer
- Trade in for equipment of like use
- Donations to a federal, state or local government entity provided the property is used for K-12 educational purposes
- Discard as waste any items, which cannot be sold, traded or donated in any manner.
The best method of disposal will be determined by what is available in your area, how much time you have to devote to the process, and the space available to sort and store the material until your chosen method can be accomplished

Samples of additional language

Environmental Grant: Obtain certification that the bus engine has been destroyed.

Sell for Scrap: Sell to a licensed salvage or scrap dealer with the highest bid.

Sell to another School District through a determined amount or a bid process
